Supplication:

Ask God to remind you of the importance of engaging the culture for the sake of the gospel without embracing the sinfulness of the culture.

Pray for an awareness of the bridges for particular people groups in your mission field. Most importantly, ask the Lord to give you a stirred heart for the lost people in the marketplace of life.

Pray for unreached people groups who are bound by Satan's lies.
